"The coming of the Christmas shoeboxes is the most eagerly awaited event of the year" - one Romanian head teacher told us.

We thank so many people for their help with the 3127 Christmas shoeboxes we sent to Romania - each donor's box made a child or adult so very happy. We thank the Constables and Parish Halls and Les Quennevais Sports Centre for allowing us to use their premises as collection places. We thank Condor Ferries Freight, Ferryspeed, Morvans-Fils in St Malo.... We thank all our wonderful volunteers who transported, checked, loaded.....



Sometimes children opened up their shoeboxes while we were in the classrooms.



At some schools the children took their boxes home unopened to open at home with their families.





Each child's shoebox contained a toothbrush and toothpaste. We thank those dentists who helped us achieve this.



Pensioners trudged through the snow to collect their shoeboxes. We sent approx. 900 boxes for adults, we were short of boxes for men this year.

More about our trip in December with the Beaulieu students



On our first day the Beaulieu students purchased food and then packed food parcels.

We gave out food parcels to the poorest of the poor on a number of occasions.



Each winter Mustard Seed raises money for bread. This winter we can afford one bread distribution per week. Over 100 beneficiaries are helped, small households all receive 2 loaves & extra for larger families.



The Beaulieu students were able to fund much needed medical treatment for this man.

A Home for Christmas



On Christmas Eve, the social worker wrote:

"Today just one day before Christmas, through the generosity of a sponsor in Jersey, we could offer a warm home to 2 homeless persons".



The older woman Florica was tricked out of her house 4 years ago and since then she has been homeless living on the streets.

Sadly this kind of deception happens too often when vulnerable people are tricked into signing papers.



The younger woman Otilia grew up in an orphanage and has been struggling to find anywhere to live and often ended up on the streets.

"They are so very thankful and cannot believe that this miracle has happened", wrote the social worker.

Now on our Changed Lives site there are 2 portercabins our old trailer, this new home, so altogether we are housing 12 people.

Soon we trust we will complete the conversion of our second trailer with 2 more units of accommodation. And finally the permanent building which is partly built, ready to fit with doors and windows, offering more housing and communal washing facilities.

Birth of a child



16 years ago Mustard Seed Jersey started a project we called "Nicus' Girls".

The girls had grown up in the Romanian orphanage system.

Since 2000, more charities have been involved.

It was a huge thrill when Nadia married and moved to USA.

Just before Christmas she gave birth to her first child.

Not all the young women we have assisted over the years are such a success story, but whereever possible we keep in touch and give them Christmas shoeboxes.



Food for the hungry TINATHON

In November 2016 some of our beneficaries benefitted from 2000 tins from Jersey from Shelter Trust's annual Tinathon appeal in May. We deliberately sent the tinned food to Romania at the start of the winter.



Due to various changes and commitments we will not be involved in Tinathon in 2017.

We sent 3 aid consignments to Romania - approx. 30 tonnes. With the May consignment we donated our now elderly trailer for conversion into housing. For subsequent consignments we used a Romanian haulier. In May 2016, we first heard of Romania's new import tax on building materials, carpets & toiletries if sent as relief aid. [Inevitably this tax impacts on Christmas shoebox contents]



We expect this will be the last carpet we are able to send to the kindergarten.



Fast progress on our Changed Lives building project, under Nelu's supervision.



We have received wonderful knitted blankets and computers to bless the Romanians with.



Our sponsorship programme continues to flourish, sponsoring needy elderly and medical pensioners and also education for children from impoverished families.

Looking ahead to 2017.



We plan 3 aid consignments to Romania in 2017 - in late spring, autumn, & December (including Christmas shoeboxes), using a Romanian haulier.

BUT with uncertainty over the implications of Brexit once Article 50 is triggered and present poor £ exchange rate we have to say these plans are only "pencilled in" and may need to be amended.



Again we plan to send Christmas shoeboxes for children and pensioners, also money for food parcels, bread & firewood for

the poorest of the poor in Bihor county of Romania next winter. We need to raise a further £13,000 to complete the Changed Lives building project at Cihei.



During 2017 we hope to continue our aid collections at Holme Grown Farm Shop carpark.

Through donations we hope to continue to support the most vulnerable through "Adopt a Granny" & child sponsorship programmes, our extended Homework Club, also general distribution programme.
